In the past few months Walter has worked in a variety of places. He made a trip to Fort St. John to be present when a lightning damaged antenna was replaced. The next week he was in Grande Prairie to initiate the high power test broadcast there (Grande Prairie has since received its Broadcast Certification). On his way home from Grande Prairie he stopped at the Fort St. John tower site to take further spectrum analysis readings. Another trip to the Grande Prairie tower site to install equipment was incorporated into a trip to see his mom in Prince Albert. The whole family was sick while we were in Prince Albert and that curtailed the visiting. It did not, however, curtail work. Walter set up a very functional office in the basement of the BNB and was also able to do regular maintenance at the tower site there. The trip home from Prince Albert included a stop in Edmonton to do computer work. While on the road he also used a Tim Horton's Wi-Fi and his phone to work with a very capable and willing volunteer, Steven Simpson, in Fort Vermilion to restore the broadcast there. After reading the above summary it might seem that Walter is always on the road, but the majority of the time he is working from home in Fort Liard. Currently he is working on an upgrade to Rivendell, the radio broadcast automation system. Psalm 127:1a says, "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labour in vain". While this update focuses on what Walter has been doing, it is the Lord who has led and enabled him. Please pray for the Lord's continued leading and enablement.



Sowing Good News with Purpose

At CIAM, we are always trying to discern what technological strategies could make the most difference for God's kingdom work. We are Good News sowers. Grain farmers use seed drills for precise sowing and use broadcast spreaders for fast coverage with little disturbance. As Good News broadcasters we know that there will be seeds that may never germinate, but this is something Jesus talks about in the parable of the sower. A part of Phil's role is to help select the right seed to be sown. The quality of seed must be proven in that it bears the fruit of our Lord Jesus. Ideally there is a consistent supply of the seeds for broadcast. Then it must have the ability to thrive in the hearts of listeners. This is a major challenge, as the hearts of humans have great variability. This is why you will find programs meeting different specific audiences throughout the listening day. A new broadcast tool with the capability to broadcast more [seed] genres & content simultaneously is in the works. It will have many new features including feedback and engagement from those on whom the good seed has landed. Much care, thought and attention is going into this with a team of builders. Continue to Pray for the CHOICE project.

Isn't it exciting to see the hand of God at work? When schedules align, the right people show up, and everything comes together, even when you're not sure how. That's what happened when the northern Alberta CIAM broadcast in Fort Vermilion suddenly went off the air.

I had committed to helping, but work delayed me. When I finally arrived, I realized I was at the wrong place, yet God was already at work, because the Telus technician was running late too and showed up at the tower shortly after.

With only basic radio knowledge, I entered "repair mode" with prayer and faith that Walter and cellphone technology would guide me. After checking the equipment, we discovered the issue was at the CIAM station, not the tower. Down the hill I went, finding more boxes with lights blinking... and some not blinking, which I had learned was not a good sign.



The faulty device we found was crucial and could have taken weeks to replace. But again, God provided: I felt prompted to search through a stack of boxes and discovered new replacement units, ones even Walter didn't know were there! I installed the station unit, returned to the tower with the Telus technician's help, who was still in town, and within minutes all the lights were blinking again. Praise God, CIAM was back on the air again! Now, one might say these were just coincidences and the products of good



organization and planning - but I believe as children of God we are called to be his "hands and feet"; and when one takes such a perspective - not only will they see the intricacies and ways in which God is merciful, faithful and loving - they will see the hand of God moving in everyday life.

Now inmates have the option of listening privately while also extending the times of day, and therefore the range of programmes that they can listen too. Like radio waves, people are tuned to different frequencies. While there is only one Truth and one gospel, it needs to be individually tuned to the hearers. In the words of Hebrews 1:1 (KJV) "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in times past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken to us by His Son." Different messages resound with different people- not just languages but content and style. VictoryFM, supported by a team from a local church, also found this at the street fair outside our studio which let us talk with more people in a day than we might talk to in months. Feel free to contact us, and we would gladly share your music on The DOVE. This fall, CIAM upgraded the transmitter to improve signal quality and installed equipment that now makes it possible for you to see which artist and song is playing on your FM radios. We want to express our thanks to James Polanski and Phil Peters, who made this upgrade happen. Relevant and timely community messages are also an important part of our broadcast, especially emergency broadcasting. Forest fires and evacuation orders again affected many northern Alberta areas this summer, which has been an intense challenge for families needing to leave their homes and live with the uncertainty of when they could return. We ask you to pray for an opportunity to extend the CIAM broadcast signal into the nearby Indigenous communities of Little Buffalo and Cadotte Lake.
